We recommend you start by reflecting on the impact of current provision and reviewing the previous spend.

The funding should be spent by 31st July but the DfE has stated that there will be no clawback of any unspent money so this can be carried forward into 2023/24.

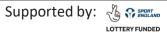




