### **Chair's Update**

Dear Parents and Carers.

I cannot believe we're at the end of the school year! I think it's the first one since the pandemic that has felt like we're no longer in a pandemic. There are big differences to how life was before though and our conversations as governors are often underpinned by an interest in the wellbeing of the children who attend our school and their families.

Understanding the views of parents and carers is really important and Michelle Cahill, one of our parent governors, may have approached you in the playground last week with a mini survey focused on your thoughts and feelings about mental health and learning support for your child or children. We have also recently heard from pupils and staff via their surveys.

As well as coming into school for our monitoring work and reviewing performance data, hearing from children, staff and parents is the most helpful way governors can understand the overall picture of how things are at school. The annual parent survey is live until the end of the school year. We'd be really grateful if you could take some time to respond as we will review all feedback in September and this will help inform our strategy review and monitoring work in the 2023-24 academic year.

This term we have carried out some monitoring to gain insights into progress of the School Improvement Plan. Governors with monitoring responsibilities have been into school to hear about the progress being made and reported back to all governors at our meeting this week.

I was delighted to welcome Nicola Field as our newly elected Staff Governor in May and at our meeting this week we approved an application for Associate Governor from Melanie Matthews who has considerable experience as a governor and through staff roles she has held in other schools.





We have been part of the Stour Federation Multi Academy Trust for the past year and whilst you may not have noticed many changes, we are starting to see some of the benefits of the opportunities this brings across the Trust and for our school. For example, best practice is being shared in both directions and this is and will continue to positively impact outcomes for children.

Finally, on a most positive note, Governors were delighted with the outcome of our SIAMS inspection. It was a real reflection of how our 'committed leaders, supported by dedicated staff, enable all to flourish in an inclusive Christian community built on love.' For me personally, it was a good reminder of why I became a governor - I felt very proud to be able to share in the recognition of some of the amazing things about our school.
