Chair's Update

Dear Parents and Carers.

It's an absolute privilege to take on the role of Chair of the Governing Body. I've had a busy few months getting up to speed with the role and I'm very fortunate to be supported by a wonderful team of governors and Sally, our clerk.

It's also been lovely to come into school more regularly after the pandemic and governors have been able to do some of the more hands-on aspects of governance recently.

I am delighted to welcome Adam Sharpe as our newly elected Parent Governor. Also joining us and bringing a wealth of experience both in the school sector and outside are Jennie May and Jill Lawrence as Associate Governors.

I want to make a special mention for Mrs Barritt whose four year term as Staff Governor has come to an end. I'm sure I speak for the whole of the Governing Body in thanking you, Mrs Barritt, for all your contributions to our activities and meetings. It's been a pleasure working with you. Recognising the importance of having the perspective of the staff team on our governing body, we are keen to elect a new Staff Governor and have started the process to do so.

This term we have been focusing on:

- Developing our governor monitoring plan for the rest of the school year.
- Assigning some new link roles for areas of focus in the School Improvement Plan and for important
 areas such as Safeguarding. Given the number of relatively new governors and recent departures
 of long-standing governors, we have been spending some time training and getting up to speed
 with our new responsibilities.
- Refining our structure further following recent changes to make sure it allows us to have effective and timely oversight, works for all governors and aligns to the MAT scheme of delegation of authority. We will reduce the number of meetings we have from nine to six and, if necessary, we will carry out some of our delegated responsibilities between meetings with link governors reporting back to all governors. This will give individual governors more time to carry out their delegated activities and create more space for training and responsibilities outside meetings.

Engagement with you is something we've talked about too. With parents' evenings now being online, there are less opportunities for governors to meet with parents and hear their views. We're reviewing how we engage with you in future and have some ideas which we'll start putting into place soon. In the meantime, please don't hesitate to get in touch with me or any of the other governors if you have anything you'd like to discuss.

An Update from Performance and Standards

I have recently become involved with monitoring Performance and Standards and the focus for this is based on the School Improvement Plan. From this we identify areas that we will be focusing on for the Monitoring Plan to help ensure all pupils make good progress and are supported to reach their potential. So far this year Governors monitored Early Years Foundation Stage. This was earlier in the year finding the Reception class had settled in well. We monitored Collective Worship and enjoyed a great assembly that was interactive and linked to the School Values and also Maths finding pupils were engaged in their activity or lesson.

Further monitoring will take place next term.

An Update from Resource and Finance

I am pleased to advise that I recently met with the school Business Manager, Mrs Lalande-Villemin, and Mrs Pollard to review the monthly financial reports provided to us by our accountant. Now that we are part of a Multi Academy Trust we receive monthly updates, and I can report that we are in a good position at present.

School has been allocated an Energy Efficiency Grant by central government and we are planning to use this to update and replace the lighting throughout the school to much more energy efficient LED lighting. School led tutoring continues in our school but with a reduced level of government subsidy. Children in Years 2, 4, 5 and 6 are currently benefiting from the scheme. I plan to review the new reports on a monthly basis going forward, and our Governing Body will have regular oversight too.
